

SPORTING REPORT

Two events have been held since the last edition of Top Gear, both at Oran Park South circuit on 23rd October and 12th December. The October event was the last opportunity to give Adrian a run for his money in the competition trophies in 2004. The December event counts towards the 2005 pointscore.

Adrian Walker achieved a second place in Class 1D to a Commodore SS Ute, in his 3.8 litre Jaguar Mark II with a best time of 58.9 seconds. Adrian's son Brendan also competed as a member of the MWSCC for a second in class 2D in his VT II SS Commodore to an RX7, with a time of 52.3 seconds.

At the December round, Adrian Walker continued his specialisation in the Oran Park South circuit as the first and only entrant in Class 1D. His 3.8 litre Jaguar Mark II achieved a best time of 58.4 seconds which was half a second better than his time in September and October. Adrian's son Brendan also competed as a member of the MWSCC for a win in class 2D in his VT II SS Commodore over three other entrants with a time of 52.3 seconds.
